The Lost sheep



This week we are discovering the meaning behind the parable of the lost sheep.



Read Luke 15:1-8 and or watch the video



Shepherds were common in the first century and would have led their "flocks in and among the hills of Palestine searching for the best grass and water. Bears, leopards, jackals and even hyenas were known to roam the hills of Palestine. The shepherd often risked his life to protect the sheep from these dangers. Sometimes a sheep would fall down a crevice and the shepherd had to climb down and pull it to safety. Every sheep was important and his goal was to keep every one of them safe.

- 1. How many sheep did the man in the parable have?
- 2. What did he do when one of the sheep got lost?
- 3. Why was the shepherd so concerned with one sheep out of a hundred
- 4. How do Shepherds care for their sheep?
- 5. What do you think Jesus is teaching us through this parable?

Every sheep is important to the shepherd. Even if only one is lost he will search everywhere to find it.
